She finished her academics in Master’s Degree at Centro Escolar University and now into thesis writing . She started working as an assistant librarian at the Circulation and the Reference Sections in La Salle Library on August 2, 1978. In 1980, she was assigned as the Acting Periodicals Librarian. Library Book Collection Matched with Course Syllabi

The DLSU Library's primary mission is to support the institution's instructional, curricular research, and extension programs through an organized, relevant, and fast delivery of information sources and services. Hence, those involved in the selection and procurement of library resources acquire them with the aid of the course syllabi. But how adequate is the library's book collection in so far as meeting the curricular needs of the university is concerned?

To answer this question, this writer made a study by matching the citations in the syllabi of the different colleges which were placed in the Intranet with those of the existing library book collections. The study which was conducted from January 2004 to April 2004 focused on the book collection for the undergraduate courses only and covered the syllabi citations of the five (5) colleges of the DLSU for the School Year 2003 – 2004. The five colleges are College of Business & Economics (CBE), College of Computer Studies (CCS), College of Education (CED), College of Liberal Arts (CLA), College of Science (COS). The College of Engineering (COE) was not included because it does not have any citation in the Intranet.

The study began by matching the undergraduate courses of the six (6) colleges listed in the DLSU Undergraduate Catalog 2000-2002 with the syllabi posted in the Intranet. It was found that only 109 courses or 9.99 % out of 1,091 courses had syllabi in the Intranet. CBE ranked first with 74 or 52.11% of courses with syllabi available in the Intranet. See Table 1.

All citations indicated in the course syllabi were then checked and matched item by item according to author, title, edition or date published. Findings of the matching activity were categorized as follows:
 a) Citations with exact matches
 b) Citations with a match but of different edition or year of publication,
 c) Citations with a match but of different author,
 d) Citations with no

match at all. Of the exact matches, strong or weak subject areas were identified. Data were ranked and tabulated. Ultimately, it is hoped that findings of this study will help upgrade the existing collection by acquiring the most current publications needed in the teaching function of the university. Combining the exact matches with those of different editions and authors, the book holdings of the DLSU Library yield a high 73.57% or 423 titles and 786 volumes. Consequently, the Library's responsibility of providing support for the curricular needs of the different colleges of the university is more than adequate. To ensure that the curricular needs of the different colleges of the university is adequately addressed, to promote the maximum usage of these material, and to eventually help upgrade the DLSU Library book collection, the following are recommended:

1) that all the colleges continuously upgrade their respective

course syllabi and publish them in the Intranet as soon as these are available;

2) that the College of Engineering and the College of Science immediately publish their course syllabi in the Intranet so that matching of the citations with the Library's holdings can be done immediately;

3) examine the 141 titles without matches and acquire them according to priority;

4) acquire the latest editions in order to continuously upgrade the library book collection;

5) strengthen the promotion of new titles acquired by the library by posting them in the Library WebOpac's "Featured Lists."

Master's degree in Library Science in 1978. She had her training in Archival Administration at the US National Archives in Washington D.C., and had training on Conservation at Payap University Archives in Chiangmai, Thailand. In the summer of 1995 she went on a study-training course on Library and Information Studies at the University of Wales, Aberystwyth, UK. She was appointed DLSU Library Director in 1994-1998. She served as Head of the National Committee for Culture and the Arts (NCCA)-National Committee on Libraries and Information Services from 2001-2004. She is currently the President of the Philippine Association of Academic and Research Libraries (PAARL), and was President of the Philippine Librarians Association, an accredited professional organization of licensed librarians. F. Verzosa has been promoted to Rank III – 5, the highest rank among the Academic Service Faculty (ASF) to date.

Verzosa Presents Paper in Vienna

Fe Angela M. Verzosa, University Archivist, presented her paper entitled “Increasing access to archival knowledge through archival cooperation and partnerships: a proposal for enhancing networking and linkage capabilities among academic archives in developing countries” at the International Council on Archives - Section on University and Research Institutions (ICA-SUV) Conference on the theme “10 Years of SUV: Past Achievements, Future Strategies”. The conference was held at Vienna University of Technology, Vienna, Austria last August 20-21, 2004 in conjunction with the ICA 15th International Congress in Vienna, August 23-29, 2004.

F. A. Verzosa is cognizant of the fact that the SUV has grown over a period of ten years and has been successful in the fulfillment of

its primary objective of strengthening relations among its members who are academic archivists in universities and research institutions thru the holding of annual seminars and conferences. However, she commented that little has been done towards the promotion of a very important association objective, i.e., archival cooperation in the fields of documentation, bibliographic access, digitization, open access scholarly publishing, and related activities that would enhance the networking and linkage capabilities among

academic archivists, particularly those in the disadvantaged regions as well as in developing nations. The strategic development of archives in these areas through collaboration, partnering schemes, and networking can create an information-rich environment, and wide opportunities to

benefit from shared information resources. She contends that part of the success of ICA-SUV will largely depend on how well its members can exploit these networking opportunities, and contribute to the development and growth of archival knowledge on a global scale. Her paper focused on bringing out the spirit of cooperation among the members by promoting the development of sustainable short-term projects that are doable and mutually beneficial, and thereby contribute to the increased access to archival knowledge.

Ladlad Lectures at World Trade Center-Manila

Jocelyn Ladlad, Librarian of the European Documentation and Resource Center (EDRC) was one of the panelists at a Panel Symposium on “Networking for Survival: a Sharing of Consortial Experiences” sponsored by the Philippine Association of Academic Libraries (PAARL) held on August 12. J. Ladlad talked about the history, projects, and the various services of the European Studies Consortium of

the Philippines. Likewise, she delivered a lecture on “Developing a World Class Library” on August 13 in a forum sponsored by the Association of Special Libraries of the Philippines (ASLP). Both symposium and lecture were held at Function Room of the World Trade Center, Roxas Boulevard on the occasion of the silver anniversary of the Manila International Book Fair.
