DLSU Library 's Outreach Program

In the early 1980's, the De La Salle University Library was involved in an outreach program although in a very limited scale, the main concern being to donate surplus materials and resources weeded from the collection especially in 1984 when the library transferred to its new building. Some members of the Inter-Institutional Consortium (I-IC) libraries and other affiliated provincial La Salle schools were the recipients of the said materials. In 1987 this program was expanded and included the new members of the DLSU System namely DLSU-Dasmariñas and DLSU-Health Science Campus.

At present, the Library's outreach program covers three areas which are: 1) training and consultancy services, (2) community service through active involvement in professional library organizations, and (3) donation of library materials. The idea of the

outreach program is to provide professional support as well as library resources to other libraries especially the less fortunate ones. Some of the faculty librarians have been involved in the first two areas of the program regularly. The third area has been extended exclusively to the members of the DLSU System and to other affiliated La Salle institutions.

In 2001, the outreach donation program was formally established. Since then, many public and private libraries and organizations have received books. Letters of requests or emails are sent to the Director, Ms. Perla T. Garcia. The Technical Services Unit of the Library is assigned to handle the giving away of books and periodicals since this is the unit directly responsible for the disposition of library materials. Dissemination of information regarding the outreach donation program is done with the

help of Faculty librarians when they lecture in national conferences. With this, the news has reached a number of interested librarians and has now gained its ground. To document the service, a donation form has been devised

As the program becomes known, the DLSU Library faces the challenge of providing more library materials and reaching out to more libraries and librarians. At present, no budget is allocated for the program. The giving away of library materials is solely dependent on duplicate copies and superseded materials acquired by the library thru donations.

Technology and Engineering Book Collection Assessed

The De La Salle University Library conducted an assessment of its collection in June 2001, where the library's holdings were checked against the 3rd edition of the standard bibliographic tool *Books for College Libraries (BCL)*, c1988. The result of the study has been the basis in filling the gaps especially in weak areas of the collection.

In its effort to continuously assess and update its collection, another study was made from September to November this year. The study focused on the present DLSU Library Technology and Engineering Collection with call numbers T- Technology (General) up to

TS – Manufactures. The objectives of the study were to find 1) the proportion of the citations on the list which has an exact match in the DLSU Engineering book holdings, 2) the proportion of the citations on the list which has a match but in different edition or year of publication in the DLSU holdings, and 3) what subject areas are the matches strong and weak.

To assess the DLSU Engineering book collection, the list was matched with Volume 1 of *The Best Books for Academic Libraries (BBAL)* (excluding TR - Photography, TT - Handicrafts, Arts and Crafts and TX - Home Economics). The entries in BBAL were

selected from the cumulative *The Best Books Database* which was organized by consulting the leading book review journals, bibliographies, and reference books with subject bibliographies. One third or approximately 60,000 from over 170,000 books from this database were selected by prominent subject librarians and subject specialists.

The table below shows the total number of entries in the BBAL, the number of entries with exact hits, the number of entries with different year and edition, sub total of combined entries and the number of entries not available at DLSU library. The study reveals that there are 1, 506 citations on

Changes and Challenges in Global Information

Globalization is the common trend in developed and developing countries nowadays. Because of this, the continuously changing and developing world of information technology makes it easier to collect, analyze, synthesize and pass on information whenever, wherever, and however it is needed. Hence, the Association of Special Libraries of the Philippines (ASLP) sponsored a seminar-workshop on the Changes and Challenges in Global Information to help Filipino librarians prepare for the changes and several issues brought by the invasion of information technology in their work. The seminar was held on November 17-19, 2004 at Subic International Hotel, Subic Bay Freeport Zone, Olongapo City. It was attended by Yolanda Odsinada- Head of the Readers Services, Elizabeth Padilla – Periodicals Librarian, Agnes Barsaga – Cataloguer, Jocelyn Laddad, EDRC and ASRC Librarian, Vivian Soriente – IMS, Purisima Fernando, Annabelle Aliwalas, and Cecille Manongsong of the Cataloging Section.

The seven (7) sessions started with the updates on the computerized cataloging and indexing tasks. This was

followed by the presentation about the techniques on evaluating library systems and software. The librarians were also taught how to develop website, the good web designing practices, updating contents and layouts, and promotions of the website. The session on *Impact of the Electronic Age on Libraries and Information Resource Centers: the European Experience*, and *Changing Role of Reference Librarians as Information Specialists*. made the DLSU librarians realized that our Library is keeping pace with the current happenings in the European world of librarianship. DLSU library and librarians underwent the same experiences such as online ordering of books and periodicals, subscription to online journals and magazines, online storage and retrieval of information, computerized lending processes, and other automated processes. It is inspiring to know that DLSU is not far behind in library automation and experiences. With the library automation, librarians were cautioned to always bear in mind provisions for the online and electronic resources when planning and designing a library. Focus must be on the purpose

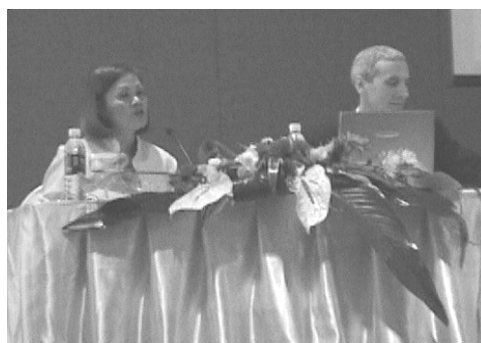
of the library, its collection, flexibility, accessibility, extendibility, variety, organization, comfort, security, and economy.

The dos and don'ts in the digital environment as far as copyright is concerned was the last topic. The developments of the copyright law in the Philippines, its origin (Spanish Law on Intellectual Property) up to its developments in relation to the electronic age and the digital environment, the liability for copyright infringement and how to manage intellectual property in the digital environment were discussed.

The seminar as a whole, made DLSU librarians realize that they are fortunate enough to belong to an advanced work environment that is able to keep pace with the current happenings in the world of library service. It gave them opportunity to share Philippine experiences in keeping up with the challenges brought about by digitization of the library environment. They now recognize their strengths and limitations in providing library services, and vow to improve more in their skills, therefore improving the present library service they are providing.

Verzosa Speaks At Library Confab In Bangkok

Our University Archivist Fe Angela M. Verzosa was among the twenty-two speakers at the recently concluded Asian Library and Information Conference (ALIC) 2004 in Bangkok held from November 21-24. She presented a paper on "The future of library cooperation in Southeast Asia." She also chaired the second session on the first day of the conference which was focused on a very timely and relevant theme, "Information Access and the Changing Role of Library and Information Professionals in the Digital Age and Knowledge-based Environment". The impact of the popular use of "Google" and "Yahoo" for quick information has affected the

changing perceptions on the role of librarians and information professionals and redefined their function as knowledge navigators. The

main objective of the conference is to address various issues currently facing Southeast Asian librarians and to provide a forum to network, share information, exchange views, and learn from each other. The conference was honored with the presence of principal guest and keynote speaker, H.E. Dr. Surapong Suebwonglee, ICT Minister of Thailand."

Also in attendance were Cres Valenzuela, DLSU Library Public Programs Coordinator, and Filipino librarians from Ateneo de Manila Professional School, Seventh Day Adventist of Silang and public school librarians in Bulacan and Cotabato.

IMS to Circulate More Mutli-Media Projectors in 2005

The Instructional Media Services (IMS) has purchased 30 more units of multi-media projectors (MMPs) – one for each 30 departments of the different colleges. They are now being processed; labeled and numbered, printed with property seal, etc. in readiness for their circulation at the start of classes in January 2005. This brings to the total of 37 multi-media projectors in circulation. The new MMPs will be stored at the IMS office. Their use is on the first come - first served basis per department.

Library Orientation Evaluated

Every term, the members of the library faculty take turns in giving orientation to the undergraduate freshmen classes. For this term, on October 11 to 27, 2004 (13 days) there were 43 out of 46 freshmen classes that were given orientation. A power point presentation on policies and procedures, online services and tutorial prepared by the Information-Reference Section staff was utilized. A 15 minute video presentation prepared by Redjie Jimenez was likewise used. The orientation in general was well received by the students as shown in the evaluation results and their comments. 684 students (99.41 %) agreed that the objectives of

the orientation were clearly stated and achieved. 98 % of the students stated that the presentation was well organized and clearly presented, searching strategies well explained, and found the library policies and procedures and the OPAC very useful. For other services, the students gave these comments and suggestions: improve the depository service, masyadong mahaba ang pila (very long queue), more computers should be added in the Cybernook, have interactive exercises, have less people during the orientation, 15 or 20 people only, time was not enough for the orientation, and the aircon is freezing cold.

Arts and Crafts and TX - Home Economics) in the *Best Books for Academic Libraries*, 2002. And that there are 351 or 23.31% entries out of these 1,506 have exact match. This is a little more than one-fifth of the cited Best Books that is found in the DLSU holdings.

The highest number of Best Books titles found in the DLSU holdings, 49 out of 140 entries or 35% is on *TJ-Mechanical Engineering and Machiner*. There are 52 entries with similar titles but in different edition or year of publication available in the DLSU collection. However, Best Book

titles on *TL - Motor vehicles. Aeronautics; TN - Mining engineering. Metallurgy; and TC - Hydraulic engineering* are very limited in the DLSU book holdings.

Based on this study it is recommended to acquire general reference materials such as dictionaries, encyclopedias, handbooks, guides, etc. preferably of latest edition, and reference classic collection. It is suggested to seek the assistance of the faculty members of the College of Engineering (COE) in reviewing the list and in prioritizing the selection and acquisition of non-reference materials.
