De La Salle University Administration Manual Amendment on item # 68: The University Research Ethics Committeeⁱ

68. The University Research Ethics Review Committee

The University Research Ethics Review Committee is the body tasked to govern the ethics of research across the University. Cognizant of the University's pursuit of its research function, the Committee ensures that researches of affiliated members of the University are of the highest standards of scientific integrity and ethical accountability. The primary task of the Committee is identifying and assessing the risks and the potential benefits of research, as well as providing guidance for the strict adherence to the University Code for the Responsible Conduct of Research, international, national and disciplinal guidelines on research ethics. The Committee members shall consist of:

- Six (6) faculty members trained in research ethics, without any University administrative position,
- One (1) social scientist,
- One (1) independent member not affiliated with the University, and
- One (1) lay member not connected with higher education and with the sciences.
