Eligibility

1. Applicants must be at least 18 but not yet 29 years of age as of August 1, 2017.
2. Undergraduate degree or first degree from an accredited college or university or its equivalent.
3. Applicants must demonstrate strong English language skills, as all teaching will be conducted in English. If the applicant's native language is not English, official English proficiency test scores must be submitted with the application. Acceptable test options are:
 - Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL PBT)
 - Internet-based Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL iBT)
 - International English Language Testing System (IELTS)
 - Pearson's (PTE Academic)
