The First Communication Research International Conference

Theme: *"Voices and Noises: Communication and Integration within and across ASEAN Communities."*

Overview

The conference seeks to nurture a culture of research in communication and media by providing faculty members and students with a venue to present and discuss their work beyond their classrooms. It is the geographic expansion of the annual National Communication Research Conference (NCRC), which began in 2010, and its precursor, the Communication Research Student Conference, which was held annually from 2007-2009. NCRC 2015 had over 600 delegates.

Date and Venue

- September 22-23, 2016 at the UP Film Center in Diliman, Quezon City

Speakers

This year's conference brings together 36 paper presentations in nine parallel sessions and plenary speakers who are noted experts in communication and media. Among the speakers are:

1. **Richard Seyler Ling, PhD** is the Shaw Foundation Professor in Media Technology of the Wee Kim Wee School of Communication and Information at the Nanyang Technological University in Singapore. A pioneer and the most-widely cited scholar in mobile communication studies, Dr. Ling recently became a Fellow of the International Communication Association.
2. **Sun Sun Lim, PhD** is an Associate Professor and the Assistant Dean of Research of the Communication and New Media Program at the National University of Singapore. She studies the social implications of technology domestication by young people and families. Her recent work has focused on understudied and marginalized populations such as young children, youths-at-risk, and migrants.
3. **Clarissa C. David, PhD** is a Professor at the UP CMC Graduate Studies Department. Dr. David was named in 2015 as an Outstanding Young Scientist by the Philippine National Academy of Science & Technology. She just completed an Angara fellowship during which she investigated social media use in government.
4. **Chalisa Magpanthong, PhD** is an Assistant Professor at Bangkok University, Thailand. She has a master's degree in International Development Studies from North Texas University, as a Fulbright scholar, and from Ohio University where she also has a PhD degree in Communication. Dr. Magpanthong studies community radio as well cross-border migration and terrorism.
