- Post regular announcements, tips, and reminders on how to prevent and mitigate social media bullying and harassment
- Develop students' digital competencies and psychosocial skills
- Social media etiquettes
- Emotional regulation in social media
- Threats and risks of digital technology
- Develop digital competencies of teachers, administrators and school personnel
- Detect risks and red flags
- Respond to reports of online bullying and harassment
- Develop mechanisms for resolving online bullying and harassment between and among students
