DLSU HOSTED THE #WECAN INTERNATIONAL BOOT CAMP from September 9 to 18, part of which was a research colloquium held last September 12 on the Manila campus. The activity sought to promote UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) localization initiatives and discuss future collaborations among ASEAN nations in the areas of social entrepreneurship and innovations.

The Boot Camp was organized by DLSU's Center for Social Concern and Action through the Lasallian Social Enterprise for Economic Development (LSEED) in partnership with the Commission on Higher

Education. The research colloquium on the other hand was co-organized by the Social Development Research Center (SDRC).

The UN SDGs seek to promote inclusive and sustainable development and encourage stakeholders and social development institutions to initiate and develop programs that will address poverty.

For the research colloquium, DLSU showcased studies on SDGs by faculty members, students, and researchers. Representatives of 25 academic institutions in the ASEAN+3 (Korea, Japan, and China) attended the event.

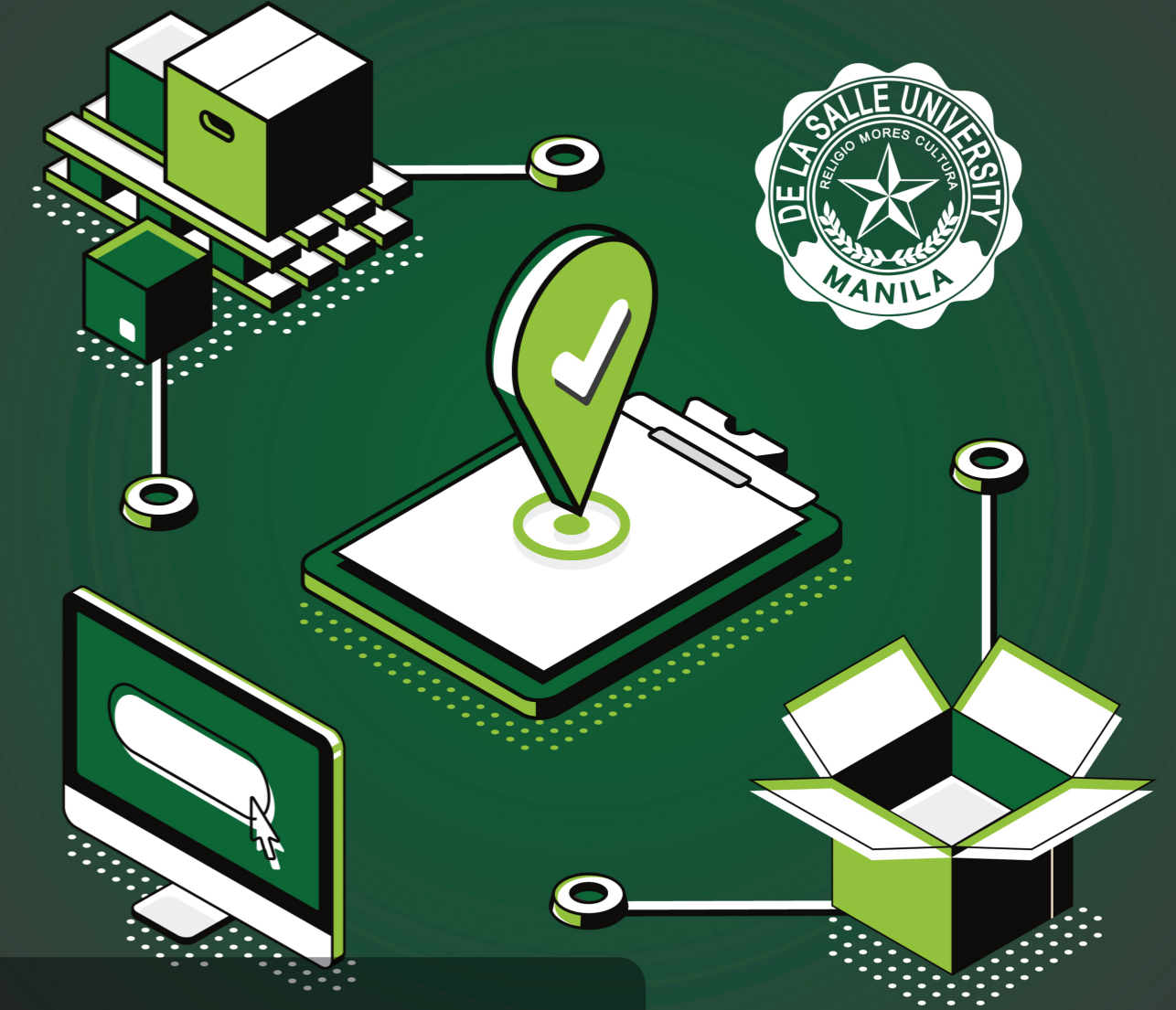

ASEAN+3 delegates visit DLSU Laguna Campus, City of Biñan

LAST SEPTEMBER 14-15, DLSU LAGUNA WELCOMED DELEGATES from 25 academic institutions in the ASEAN+3 (Korea, Japan, and China) who participated in the #WeCAN International Boot Camp.

The DLSU Lasallian Mission Office (LMO) and Center for Concern and Action (COSCA) led the participants, who also toured the City of Biñan as part of the 10-day #WeCAN program that provided opportunities for social entrepreneurship collaborations.

DLSU Laguna served as a venue of the Boot Camp's team-building activities with The Outstanding Students of the Philippines Alumni Community-NCR as facilitators. Toyota-City of Sta Rosa GK Village hosted the community visit and exposure of the delegates during the second day.

#WeCAN International Boot Camp was held on DLSU's Manila and Laguna campuses from September 9 to 18.



The launch was held on September 24 at the Tent at Solaire in Pasay City, in conjunction with the two-day Safer Mobility and Logistics Conference and Exhibition attended by the concerned sectors' various stakeholders.

The Institute will draw on complementary talents available from the University, in particular from the College of Computer Studies, Gokongwei College of Engineering, and Ramon V. del Rosario College of Business.

It will offer graduate degree programs, elective courses, professional training, R&D, partnerships, and extension services.

ERLI Executive Dean Dr. Manuel Biona will be strongly working with the industry to forged more responsive supply chain strategies, efficient and greener logistics and seamless mobility.

DE LA SALLE UNIVERSITY OFFICIALS PAID A COURTESY CALL TO MANILA MAYOR FRANCISCO "ISKO MORENO" DOMAGOSO last October 1 at the Manila City Hall to push for the establishment of a knowledge partnership that will foster data-driven governance.

Chancellor Br. Bernard Oca FSC, Political Science Associate Professor Dr. Francisco Magno, and Office for

Strategic Communications Executive Director Johannes Leo Badillo briefed Mayor Isko on how DLSU can help the City of Manila an advocate of the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

Call for Proposals

Dr. Ponciano S. Intal, Jr. Memorial Research Grants for AY 2019-2020 for full-time faculty members

To perpetuate the memory of Dr. Ponciano S. Intal, Jr., founding executive director of the DLSU Angelo King Institute for Economic and Business Studies, the AKI Call for Proposals beginning this academic year will be named as Dr. Ponciano S. Intal, Jr. Memorial Research Grants (PSI Memorial Research Grants).

The PSI Memorial Research Grants are intended to elicit research proposals in three areas: 1) Poverty Research; 2) Food Research; and 3) Research on Entrepreneurship and Family Business.

Five proposals will be selected for each of the three research themes and each proposal will be awarded a PHP120,000 grant. All recipients of grants will be selected by a review committee of the Angelo King Institute.

The application is open to all full-time DLSU faculty members. The deadline for the submission of proposals is at 5 pm on October 30, 2019.
