In his welcome message during the event, Dr. Francisco Magno, project leader of the Civic Education Project, emphasized that this cooperation will lead to the development of a series of working papers that will provide guidance in the creation of new content to strengthen the delivery of civic education in the country.

YouthLed Chief of Party Natalie Christine Jorge remarked that the collaboration aims to increase our knowledge and understanding of the education interventions needed to promote active citizenship and to foster democratic participation among the youth.

Dr. Arnulfo Mascarinas, BU president, shared the profound commitment of the state university to the objectives of the project. He expressed confidence that Dr. Alex Nepomuceno, dean of the College of Social Sciences and Philosophy, will provide effective stewardship to the BU team to ensure the success of the partnership.

Dr. Ador Torneo, director of DLSU JRIG, closed the event by reiterating the important role of the youth in charting the nation's future.

He added that it serves as a foundation for harnessing the power of technology to improve learning outcomes and bridging the industry-academe gap to make better opportunities available to students around the world.

He also shared that the conference opened an opportunity to network with global thought leaders in education, especially in the era of post-COVID-19 pandemic.



CCS conducts 1st International Workshop on Applied Computing in Agriculture

THE DLSU DEPARTMENT OF COMPUTER TECHNOLOGY OF THE COLLEGE OF COMPUTER STUDIES HELD the first online International Workshop on Applied Computing in Agriculture or "AgriApp 2022" last March 4 and 5.

The workshop was led by DOST Balik Scientist and DLSU Department of Computer Technology faculty member Dr. Dan Jeric Arcega Rustia and was attended by nearly a thousand participants.

Sessions focused on developing data-driven smart agricultural technologies. The themes included: "Smart Agricultural Technology in the Philippines", "Robotics and Automation", "Artificial Intelligence", "Deep Learning in Agriculture," and "Internet of Things in Agriculture."

The workshop was co-chaired by Department of Computer Technology Chair Jocelynn Cu, Advanced Research Institute for Informatics, Computing and Networking (AdRIC) Director Dr. Joel Ilao, Department of Computer Technology faculty Clement Ong, and partners from the National Taiwan University Department of Biomechatronics Engineering: Distinguished Professor Ta-Te Lin, Assistant Professor Shih-Fang Chen, and Department Chair Professor Kuo-Chi Liao.

It was funded by the DLSU Office of the Vice Chancellor for Research and Innovation (VCRI) and DOST Philippine Council for Agriculture, Aquatic and Natural Resources Research and Development (PCAARRD).

VCRI Dr. Raymond Girard Tan and CCS Dean Dr. Rafael Cabredo delivered messages to welcome the attendees.

The event featured parallel lectures and hands-on tutorials by DLSU and Pacific American School, Taiwan to allow participants to develop small software-based projects.

A hackathon was also held for the students. The winners were Chin-Rong Siang from Universiti Teknologi Malaysia and Alseo Earl Abraham from DLSU for the "Deep Learning in Agriculture" track, and Joel Salazar from Pampanga State Agricultural University, Toni-An Mae Salcedo from the University of the Philippines - Los Banos, and Pinky Melanie Panlasigui from Isabela State University for the "Internet of Things in Agriculture" track.


student leaders of DLSU Laguna Campus last March 24.

The Uniservitate Award 2022 recognizes service-learning projects in Catholic Higher Education Institutions (CHEIs). As a global award, it covers Africa, Asia and Oceania, Central and Eastern Europe and the Middle East, Latin America and the Caribbean, USA & Canada, and Western Europe (North and South).

Universitate Award 2022 aims to recognize the best service-learning experiences of each region, particularly those that respond to the real needs of the poor and marginalized sectors of society. The award's objective is to make visible good educational and solidarity practices to inspire new initiatives so that the social impact is greater.

Uniservitate's global network is present in 26 countries on 5 continents through partnerships with more than 30 universities and higher education institutions. De La Salle University serves as its Service-Learning Regional Hub for Asia and Oceania.

The award will consider all the initiatives – even the most incipient - that have been launched between January 2019 and April 2022 within the framework of CHEIs from anywhere in the world.

A total of 84,000 euros will be given to the winners to give continuity to the awarded projects or to start others. The Universitate Awardees will also receive funding to participate in the Uniservitate's 3rd Global Symposium, which will take place in Rome from October 26 - 30, 2022.

The Uniservitate Award is organized by the Global Uniservitate Program, under the coordination of CLAYSS (Centro Latinoamericano de Aprendizaje y Servicio Solidario) and Porticus, in adherence to the Global Compact on Education.
