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Faculty members shine at 2024 NAST Awards

De La Salle University celebrates the string of awards received by its faculty members at this year's National Academy of Science and Technology (NAST) Awards.

Three faculty members are recipients of the Outstanding Young Scientist (OYS) Award: Dr. Angelo Earvin Choi of the Department of Chemical Engineering; Dr. Jerome Cleofas of the Department of Sociology and Behavioral Sciences; and Dr. Jose Isagani Janairo of the Department of Biology.

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The OYS Awards are given to young Filipino scientists below the age of 40 years who have made significant contributions to science and technology.

For the Outstanding Book Award, the following works and contributing members from the Lasallian community were named this year's winners: A Handbook of Protocols for the Conduct of Reef Assessments in the Philippines with editors Dr. Katrina Luzon, Francis Xavier Verdadero, Ysadora Mendoza, and Dr. Wilfredo Licuanan; Ang Mabuting Kita: Mga Isyu ng Etika sa Negosyo by Dr. Napoleon Mabaquiao, Jr.; and Patronage Democracy in the Philippines: Clans, Clients, and Competition in Local Elections, with editors Dr. Julio Teehankee and Dr. Cleo Anne Calimbahin.

The Outstanding Book Awards are given annually for books and/or monographs published by Filipino publishers based in the Philippines within five years preceding the award.


For the Outstanding Scientific Paper, among the named winners are: "Does altruism affect purchase intent of green products? A moderated mediation analysis" by Dr. Reynaldo Bautista, Jr., Dr. Rayan Dui, Dr. Luz Jeong, and Dr. Miguel Paolo Paredes; "Political Illiberalism in the Philippines: Analyzing Illiberal Political Values" by Dr. Anthony Lawrence Borja; and "Development of Risk-targeted Seismic Hazard Maps for Low-rise and Mid-Rise Reinforced Concrete Buildings in the Philippines" by Royce Argel Mallari, Dr. Lessandro Estelito Garciano, and H. Peñarubia.

The Outstanding Scientific Paper Awards is given annually for papers published in Thomson Reuters or SCOPUS-listed journals in the Philippines within five years preceding the award.

In the Talent Search for Young Scientists, which aims to encourage young people to pursue a career in science, Dr. Neil Patrick del Gallego of the College of Computer Studies received a Special Citation.

Likewise, Dr. Ivan Henderson Gue of the Gokongwei College of Engineering bagged a Special Citation in the NAST Environmental Science Award (NESA), which is intended to recognize outstanding scientific and technological research work that contributes to environmental protection and conservation.

DLSU journal ranks Q1 in Social Sciences and Citation Index

The Asia-Pacific Education Researcher (TAPER), a De La Salle University journal published by Springer, is now ranked Q1 in the Social Sciences and Citation Index (SSCI), Education and Educational Research Category.

Q1 journals comprise the most statistically prestigious journals within the subject category, belonging to the top 25% of the journals on the list.

TAPER provides a venue for empirical and theoretical studies in education, with emphasis on the experiences of successful educational systems in the Asia-Pacific Region.

It publishes research on educational processes and outcomes using the research methods and analytic frameworks of varied academic disciplines and multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary approaches.

DLSU Publishing House Executive Director Dr. Jonathan Bayot expressed gratitude for the distinction as he congratulated TAPER editor-in-chief Prof. Timothy Teo and the rest of the TAPER editorial team, together with his colleagues and friends at DLSU.



La Salle team bags top prize in international Service Learning awards

A faculty-student team from the DLSU Ramon V. del Rosario College of Business (RVR COB) garnered the First Place Award in the Uniservitate Award 2024 – Service Learning (SL) Experiences in Catholic Higher Education, following the Jury Deliberation Meeting held last June 25.

The winners, faculty member Angelique Blasa-Cheng and student group representative Alex Kayne Santiago of the Department of Management and Organization received the award for their SL entry titled "Project MAGKASAPI - MAGkasamang KAunlaran SA Pag-aaral at Paglalarong Intelektwal".

The project was the output of their 2023 SL course, Corporate Social Responsibility and Governance. The group, together with their professor and SL coordinator Karol Jim Louis Castillo, was composed of Christella Audrey

Garin, Gillian Maegan Montalbo, Sonya Nimfa Mari Go, Luis Augustine Morente, Andrea Nicole Bugarin, Marc Joshua Mariano, Rav Ryan Ocampo, Yvan Kyle Orate, Jem Rhey Parrocho, Fredrich Russell To, and Alex Kayne Santiago.

The project gamified information about disaster risk reduction management by creating board games for typhoon response, earthquake drills, and fire prevention. The board games were used by the children and the barangay beneficiaries of Share An Opportunity Philippines in Iloilo City. The institution will receive €5000 to further the winning SL project and/or develop new ones.

Moreover, two other course projects from RVR COB made it into the finals. The projects were "Sweet Harmony Empowering Communities through Trifle Delights and Sustainable



Merchandising" handled by Dr. Adrian Mabalay and "Career Boost: Resume Writing and Job Interview Preparation Toolkit" taught by Angelique Blasa-Cheng.

The Uniservitate Awards 2024 Regional Awarding Ceremony will be held at the Fu Jen Catholic University, Taiwan on September 25. The winners are invited to participate in the V Uniservitate Global Symposium on November 7-9, 2024 at the Università LUMSA - Libera Università Maria Ss. Assunta, Rome, Italy.

The Uniservitate Award aims to identify and showcase the initiatives that combine academic excellence and the concrete testimony of a socially committed institution. It also acknowledges and promotes Catholic educational institutions that best integrate undergraduate academic learning with community service.
