

DLSU gets new patent for recycled paper cups

DE LA SALLE UNIVERSITY GARNERED A NEW PATENT FROM THE INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY OFFICE OF THE

PHILIPPINES (IPOPHL) for its latest invention, which presents an enabling framework for more ways to recycle paper cups.

Developed by Department of Biology faculty member Dr. Jose Isagani Janairo and Department of Chemistry part-time faculty member Brandon Cyril Lira, the invention called "Rollable pipette tip material" provides an innovative approach to solving the overwhelming problem of plastic waste management.

The researchers have noted that among the most abundant plastic wastes but very challenging to recycle are paper cups lined with a thin polyethylene film, also known as paper plastic laminates (PPL).

They presented the creation of pipette tips from disposed coffee cups as an inventive way of recycling PPL. The fabricated PPL pipette tips exhibit comparable accuracy in drawing and dispensing liquids compared with the standard polypropylene pipette tips.

The created PPL pipette tips are ideal to be used in lower-level educational experiments where research-grade consumables are not a crucial requirement. The presented proof-of- concept has promising potential in aiding the waste management of disposable paper cups and pipette tips, thus

making laboratory science education more sustainable.

This invention is Janairo's second patent. He previously earned a patent for the invention, "Hand tool for determining if a rubber cup lump is battery acid-coagulated," which seeks to promote the competitiveness of the Philippine rubber industry.

BERNARDO was recently elected to the Executive Committee of the International Union of Psychological Science (IUPsyS) during the General Assembly meetings in Prague, Czech Republic.

The IUPsyS is the largest global organization for psychologists, comprising 82 member countries and 20 affiliated organizations, representing over a million psychologists worldwide.

Bernardo's research interests include lay theories of culture and intergroup relations, system justifying beliefs and socioeconomic inequality, hope and well-being in Asian societies, and cultural aspects of motivation, learning, and achievement in school.

He served as President of AASP from 2015 to 2017; before that he was President of the ASEAN Regional Union of Psychological Societies, and of the Psychological Association of the Philippines. He also served as Editor-in-Chief of the Asian Journal of Social Psychology from 2018 to 2020 and Editor of The Asia-Pacific Education Researcher from 2001 to 2012.







Doy del Mundo releases new book, Disconnected Media and Other Essays

LAUNCHED "DISCONNECTED MEDIA AND OTHER ESSAYS,"

by Professor Emeritus and renowned screenwriter and director Dr. Clodualdo Del Mundo, Jr. last August 3 at the DLSU Henry Sy, Sr. Hall.

The book is a collection of essays on Philippine film and television, media archiving and history, society and culture, and the media at large, spanning the 1990s until the COVID-19 pandemic.

Del Mundo cuts insightful analyses of film and the media's evolving role in Philippine society. With his POV as industry insider and academician, Del Mundo offers an important new resource for media educators.

In the book's introduction, Del Mundo remarks: "After all these years of observing Pinoy media, I'm convinced that it is essentially disconnected from the public. The box-office receipts of highly popular movies and the ratings of top TV shows may be argued as proof of some connection with their audiences, but does media really connect with the needs and aspirations of Pinoys? Moreover, there seems to be a disconnect between what Philippine media is doing and what it is supposed to be."

A separate book launch was organized by the Cultural Center of the Philippines as part of its 20th Cinemalaya activities at Ayala Malls, Makati last August 5.
