

Laguna Campus opens University Hall

DLSU Laguna Campus inaugurated the University Hall, a state-of-the-art facility designed to foster modern learning and sustainability. The new building features classrooms equipped with cutting-edge lighting, acoustics, and technology, with the aim of creating an optimal learning environment.

With a total floor area of 7,912 sqm, this four-story building serves as the primary instructional facility for its college students and a hub for research.


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DLSU is pursuing LEED Certification for the University Hall, a first for educational buildings in the Philippines, as part of its commitment to environmental responsibility. Alongside the Enrique K. Razon Jr. Hall, the University Hall is eyed to set a new benchmark for educational infrastructure in the Philippines.

The building caters to the diverse needs of faculty and students by providing modern amenities that ensure comfort and convenience.

Aside from modern classroom and collaborative learning spaces and student hubs, the University Hall will also feature laboratories, a design studio, and a counseling center. It will also house the Faculty Center and Lounge and Faculty Online Teaching Center, as well as a canteen and dining hall, clinic, the Security Office, data center, and research commons. DLSU faculty members also collaborate with PwC mentors to help students successfully balance their academic requirements with their professional development. The collaboration also includes a specialized M&A elective

SGV Academy to bolster accounting education at DLSU

De La Salle University signed a memorandum of agreement (MOA) with the SGV Academy last January 28 at the Henry Sy Hall, in a bid to enhance accounting education and bolster the accounting profession.

The MOA is part of the SGV Academy program in partnership with universities across the country. This initiative encompasses the enhancement of courses and syllabi, development of educators, part-time teaching roles for SGV professionals, guest lectures, hands-on workshops, and student internship opportunities.

Additionally, it will allow selected students to immerse themselves in the SGV Experience through the Cooperative Education program within DLSU's Bachelor of Science in Accountancy (BSA) curriculum, aligning with SGV's mission to nurture leaders and enable businesses for a better Philippines.

Distinguished Professor honored with Fellowship award

Dr. Anthony SF Chiu, a University Fellow and Distinguished Professor of the Department of Industrial and Systems Engineering, was recognized as a Fellow of the Taipei-based Chinese Institute of Industrial Engineers. This achievement marks Chiu as the first foreign Fellow awarded since its inauguration in 1962.

Chiu is one of the top researchers in DLSU based on cumulative career statistics. He concurrently serves as the Vice President for External Relations and Internationalization. He is a member of the United Nations International Resource Panel and a member of the Future Earth KAN on Systems of Sustainable Consumption and Production.

Furthermore, he is the founding vice-chair of the Industrial Engineering Certification Board and became the first Philippine awardee of the American Society of Mechanical Engineers as an outstanding international correspondent and the first Philippine ASEAN Engineer in Industrial Engineering from academe.

Economics profs tackle pathways to progress in Congress forum

The De La Salle University (DLSU) Carlos L. Tiu School of Economics, together with the Congressional Policy and Budget Research Department (CPBRD), organized the two-day forum, "Pathways to Progress: Transforming the Philippine Economy," last January 21-22 at the House of Representatives.

Over 100 participants from different government agencies attended the event, which served as a venue to discuss the future of the Philippine economy. Welcome remarks were delivered by CPBRD Deputy Secretary General Dr. Romulo Miral, CPBRD Director General Manuel Aquino, DLSU Vice President for Research and Innovation Dr. Raymond Tan, and DLSU Carlos L. Tiu School of Economics Dean Dr. Arlene Inocencio.

On Day 1, Dr. Jesus Felipe opened the presentations and discussion. He argued that while the nation is doing relatively well, there is room to do better. He pointed out that many of the country's regional neighbors, with lower per capita income not long ago, have overtaken us, as they focus on the transformation of the economy.

Dr. Mariel Monica Sauler gave a presentation on the country's economic transformation and provided forecasts until 2050. Dr. Gerardo Largoza spoke on productivity of Filipino firms, characterized by low productivity. Dr. Christopher James Cabuay talked about employment trends and education.

For their part, Dr. Wonhyuk Lim of the Korea Development Institute, Korea focused on lessons from South Korea's economic experience, while Ms. Cha-Ly Koh of Urbanmetrics, Malaysia highlighted the importance of good cities for development.

Dr. Alellie Sobreviñas provided estimates of the cost of living in the Philippines, in terms of a decent basket." Sessions were followed by an open forum, allowing for participant engagement.

On Day 2, Dr. Jesus Felipe and Dr. William Mitchell of the University of Newcastle, Australia discussed the use of the budget deficits and national debt as development tools. Their discussion was followed by a Q&A session and discussion.

The DLSU team argued that while in overall terms the economy is doing relatively well, there is a need to change the development model, from a myriad of reforms that have led to just \$4,200 per capita income to one that focuses on productivity, the transformation of the economy, firms, and exports.

Second, the DLSU team argued that the monetary reality of a sovereign nation like the Philippines, which naturally uses fiat money, implies that the government can pay for the infrastructure, health, education, children nutrition, pensions, and other social programs.


partnerships toward a more responsive, future-proof curriculum, among many others.
