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DE LA SALLE UNIVERSITY THROUGH THE OFFICE OF THE VICE PRESIDENT FOR EXTERNAL RELATIONS AND INTERNATIONALIZATION (OVPERI) hosted the 2025 Network for Education and Research on Peace and Sustainability (NERPS) International Conference, in partnership with Hiroshima University. The event was held on campus last March 5-7.

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NERPS 2025 marked the 10th anniversary of adopting the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development. It brought together distinguished keynote speakers and scholars who presented across multiple parallel sessions, covering a wide range of SDG-related topics.

DLSU President Br. Bernard Oca FSC in his welcome remarks acknowledged Prof. Shinji Kaneko, executive vice president and director of NERPS at Hiroshima University, who served as conference chair.

He also cited the main contributors of the event, including DLSU Vice President for External Relations and Internationalization Dr. Anthony Shun Fung Chiu; DLSU Jesse M. Robredo Institute of Governance and SDG City Project Leader Dr. Francisco Magno; Special Assistant to the NERPS Director Masatoshi Sato; and Associate Professor of Peace and Security at Hiroshima University Dr. Dahlia Simangan.

Br. Bernie underscored the University's commitment to localize the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), sharing a number

of DLSU initiatives, among them the creation of the SDG City model in key cities and provinces across the country, as well as DLSU's three-year term as Chair and Secretariat of the UN Sustainable Development Solutions Network (SDSN) - Philippines, which is composed of more than 30 universities and knowledge institutions,

Likewise, Minister and Consul General Hanada Takahiro from the Embassy of Japan in the Philippines and Department of Environment and Natural Resources Undersecretary Dr. Carlos Primo David delivered welcome remarks in the event.

Keynote speakers for the event were Rector of the United Nations University and UN Under-Secretary-General Prof. Tshilidzi Marwala, who underscored the urgent need to work together for peace, security, and sustainability vis-a-vis the possibilities of Al and digital technologies; and Prof. Alvin Culaba, Commissioner on Science and Technology at the UNESCO National Commission of the Philippines and DLSU University Fellow, who shared about UNESCO's role in the promotion of science and technology.

AUN-QA RELEASES INSTITUTIONAL REASSESSMENT REPORT



MARCH 11, De La Salle University President Br. Bernard Oca FSC announced the successful completion of DLSU's Institutional Reassessment by the ASEAN University Network (AUN-QA).

The AUN-QA team's site visit last November has yielded a report citing DLSU's strengths across 15 criteria, most notably in Leadership and Strategy, Financial and Physical Resources, Quality Assurance System, and Financial and Market Results. As ever,

these are paired with recommendations for our continuous improvement as an institution.

Br. Bernie acknowledged those who contributed to this successful reassessment: the AUN-QA Assessor Team, led by Prof. Dr. Satria Bijaksana of the Institut Teknologi Bandung; the DSLSU Trustees, University Fellows, administrators, faculty, students, support staff, alumni, and external partners.

He also expressed gratitude to the staff of the Strategic Management and Quality Assurance Office (SMQA), and to the team of Dr. Wyona Patalinghug, Dr. Kimberley Migallos, Dr. Julita Robles, and Dr. Gerardo Largoza, who oversaw preparations of DLSU's Self-Assessment Report (SAR).

This program is intended to boost the global outlook and competitiveness of DLSU research by allowing the faculty and students

to work closely with elite-level international talent. During their respective visits, the Golden Jubilee Honorary Professors gave talks based on their research expertise and held brainstorming discussions with DLSU researchers.

Br. Bernie shares DLSU initiatives in ASEAN Universities Forum

DLSU PRESIDENT BR. BERNARD OCA FSC JOINED THE ASEAN UNIVERSITIES FORUM held last February 17 in Japan, which centered on the theme, "New initiatives and collaborations in higher education".

The forum tackled the latest technological developments such as Artificial Intelligence, bio- and nanotechnology, digitization, robotics, and other advancements summarized in the term Industry 4.0, or the Fourth Industrial Revolution, and their impacts on education.

For his part, Br. Bernie talked about the core values of the University, i.e. Spirit of Faith, Zeal for Service, and Communion in Mission, as it navigates the future with these technologies.

He said that AI, for instance, can be useful in enriching our relationship with God. He shared that DLSU created a unit for AI integration into the curriculum, and that faculty and students are given freedom to use these AI tools within certain parameters.

Likewise, Br. Bernie said that DLSU faculty's works are aimed at using Al, data science, and other new technologies in the service of others, especially the most vulnerable. Among these initiatives are a series of research using machine learning to analyze large datasets for DepEd policy-making. Another is geared to improve city traffic, to reduce the estimated USD 22.9 billion lost annually in foregone revenue and wasted expenses on account of traffic congestion.

He also talked about DLSU's approach to Al adoption vis-a-vis Communion in Mission. "By this we mean promoting solidarity and collaboration in all we do, and developing a greater sense of openness to alkpersons, again, especially toward those in need."

Among the initiatives he mentioned are partnerships with industry, investing in state-of-the=art facilities, and hosting of research conferences on Al.

ENTREPRENEURSHIP among higher education institutions, De La Salle University through the Lasallian Social Enterprise for Economic Development (LSEED)


