In my first year as the 24th president of De La Salle University, I witnessed amazing stories of our Lasallian community's shared commitment to spark change and bring hope through our various programs and initiatives as a leading academic resource. We celebrated our accomplishments and achievements, knowing that at the core of all these is the basic desire to help improve the quality of life and create a sustainable future for all.

Academic Year 2021-2022, which marked the centenary of the St. La Salle Hall, put into focus the continuing story of how this beautiful structure has become an icon of Lasallian heritage and a national landmark: as the birthplace of luminaries in business, public service, education, science and technology, and the arts, it remains a nurturing home to outstanding faculty and students.



Part of our continuing pursuit of excellence is our institutional accreditation with the Philippine Accrediting Association of Schools, Colleges, and Universities. For the academic year, we received a 5-year re-accreditation for our MBA programs, among others. We also marked the fourth straight year of being the lone Philippine private university included in the Times Higher Education (THE) World University Rankings. We also garnered recognition from partner institutions such as the Department of Science and Technology.

Meanwhile, we also continued reforms that were introduced in previous years. BITUIN, or the Banner Initiative to Transform, Unify, Integrate, and Navigate, allowed us to automate and digitize key processes in finance, human resources, and the student life cycle, as we set our sights and continued our efforts towards achieving significant cost savings and highly improved DLSU work experience.



We have likewise significantly revamped our organizational chart to further simplify and rationalize governance at DLSU. In the revision of our Administration Manual, we affirmed the role of our college Deans as part of the University's top management to support their strategic work. At the same time, we improved the performance evaluation and salary scaling of faculty by introducing a scorecard.

This year, we also completed work on the DLSU Code of Conduct and Metapolicy. Our Code of Conduct sets clear expectations of behavior not just for members of the DLSU community but our external partners as well. It harmonizes provisions and sanctions across our different manuals so that we are all guided by principles that are applied consistently, regardless of whether we are faculty, staff, administrators, or students.



Our Metapolicy, on the other hand, provides support for a way of crafting policies, procedures, standards, and guidelines, embedding consultation, clarity, good faith, and desirable characteristics of Lasallian governance. We also held the first Institutional Reflection Day to help us further explore what it meant to be a modern, efficient, yet close-knit and ethical University.

At the same time, DLSU continued to localize the UN Sustainable Development Goals, further encouraging active collaboration between faculty, students, and partner communities for the development of solutions to real-world problems. We promoted Service-Learning with foreign partners and international linkages and likewise introduced various initiatives supporting our Lasallian Mission. The period of national elections allowed our Lasallian community to engage in meaningful, political discussions with various sectors as we sought to strengthen our nationhood.



In preparation for the reopening of our campuses as we move forward from the pandemic, we continued to prioritize the wellbeing and safety of everyone in our community.

We continued to expand our capabilities as a research university by building research hubs and collaborative learning spaces. To promote the holistic development of our students and the rest of the Lasallian community, we built and improved our sports facilities and spiritual spaces. The construction of the Santuario de La Salle on our Laguna Campus entered its final phase as its inauguration was set by the final quarter of 2022.



The final trimester of AY 2021-2022 offered programs that allowed for DLSU's smooth transition back to the regular trimestral schedule that approximated the Commission on Higher Education's academic calendar for state colleges and universities.

To sum it up, this academic year reflected our evolving roles and vision of the future as we strived to remain faithful to our Lasallian Mission through meaningful, faith-filled, and excellent work in education.

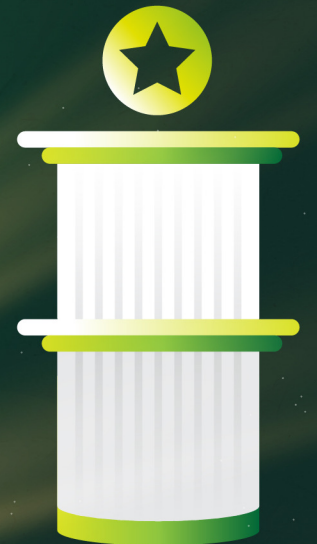

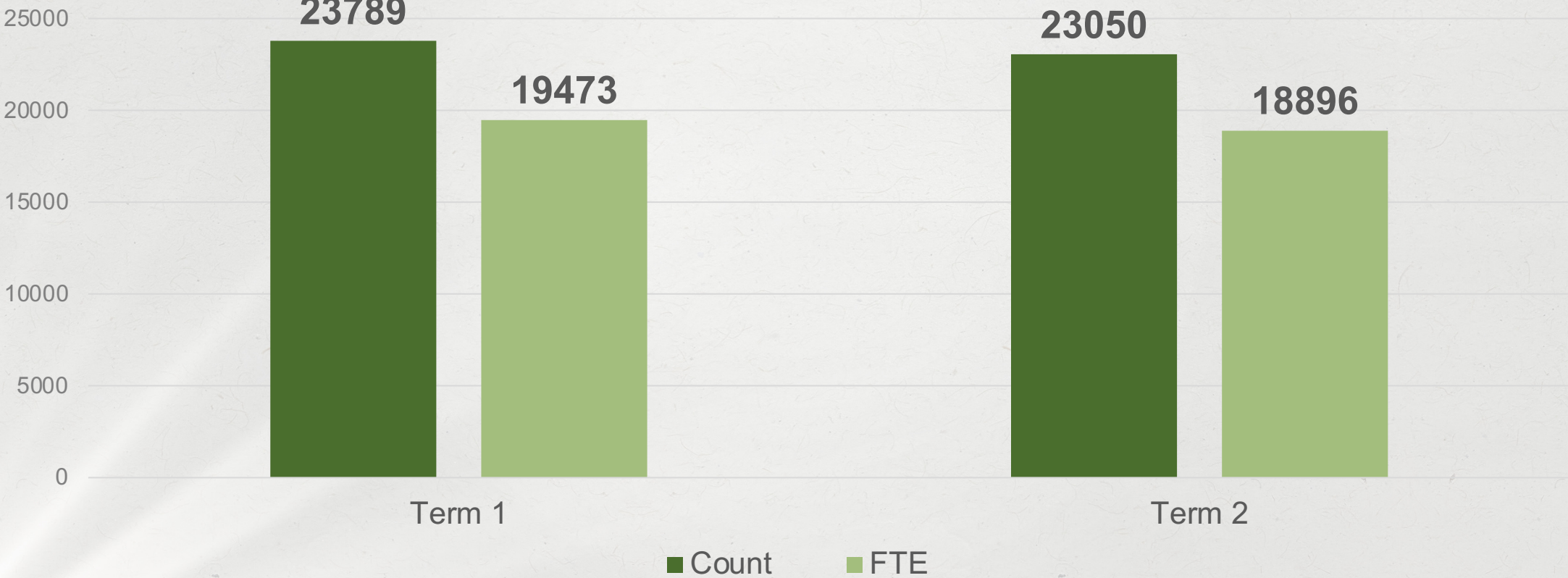

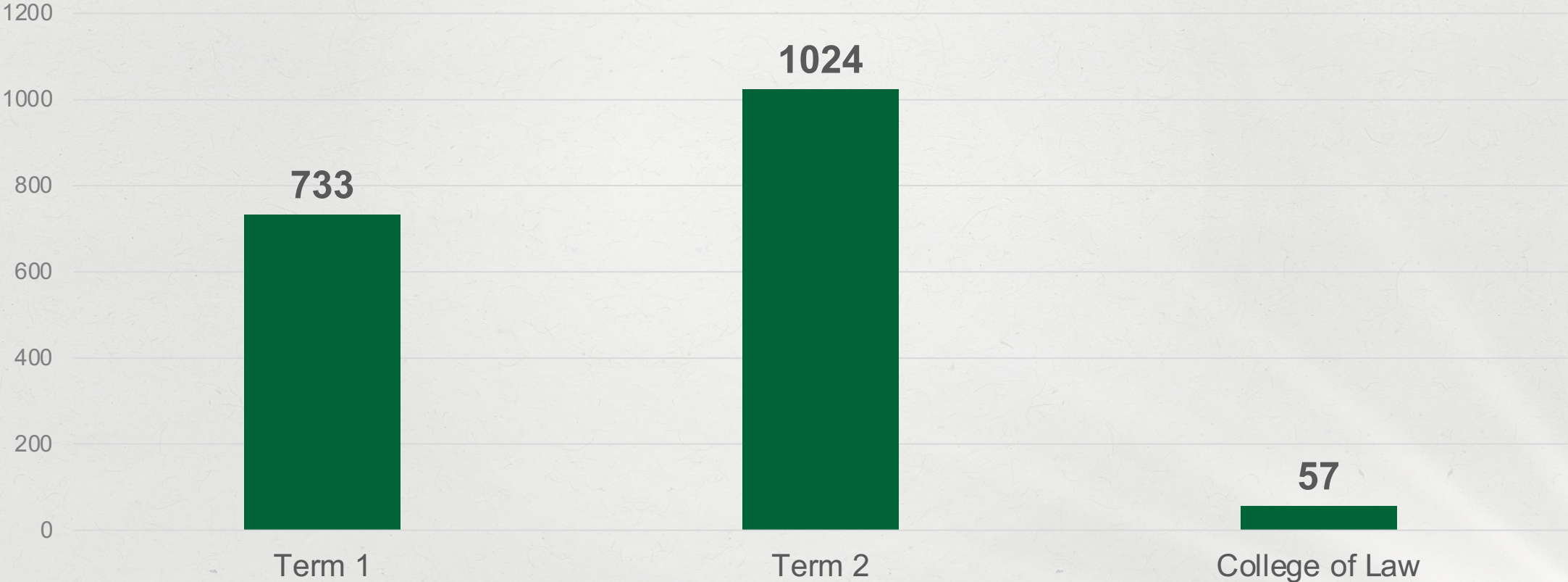
Enrollment Statistics

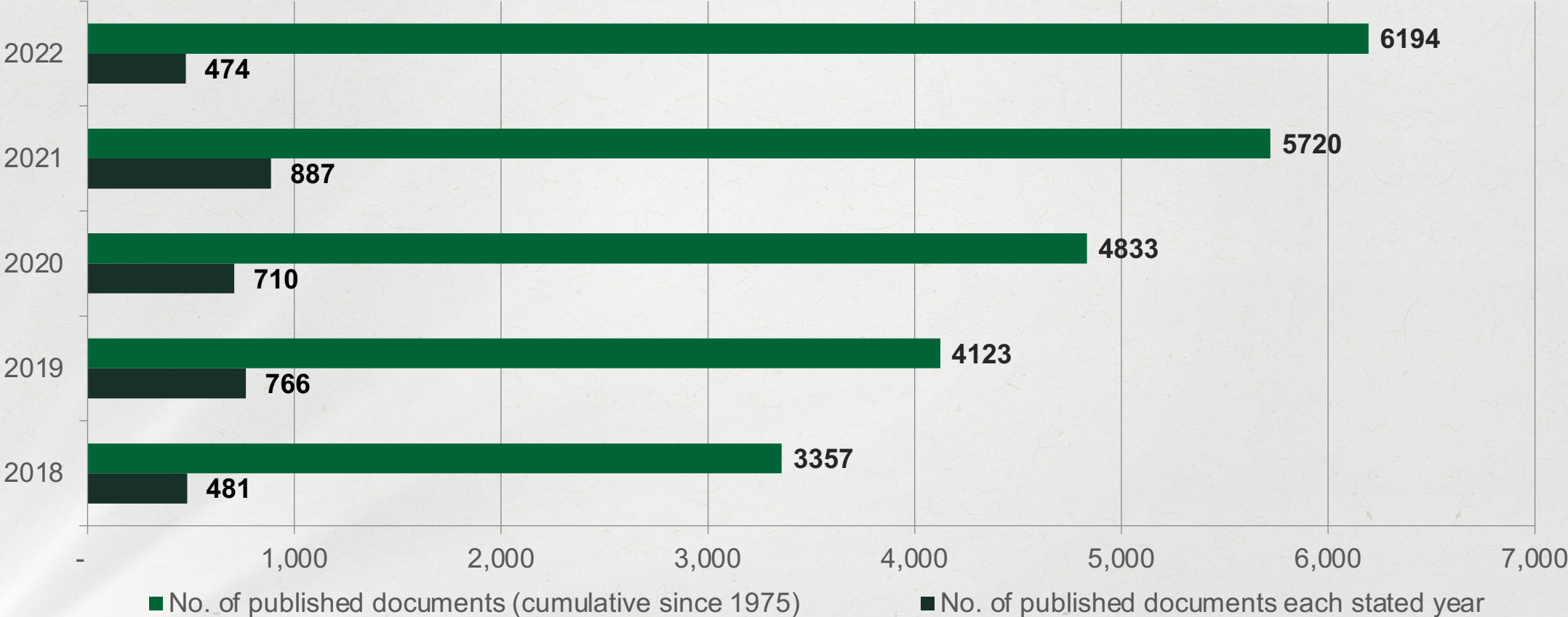
Research

To boost intellectual property, technology transfer, and innovation research in the country, DLSU partnered with the Intellectual Property Office of the Philippines for seminars to its faculty. The University also filed patent applications for a number of faculty research projects, two of which were granted during the year. Meanwhile, the University's annual output of Scopus-indexed publications consistently outperformed that of other private higher education institutions (HEIs) in the country.



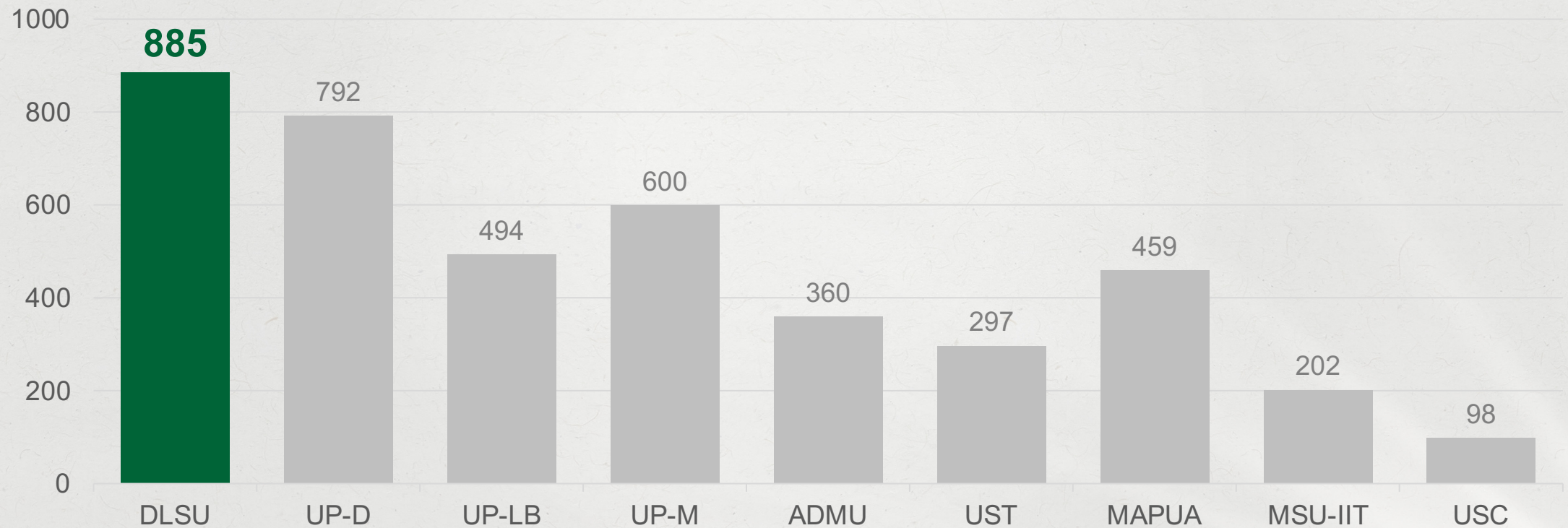
DLSU cumulative publications

As of August 2022



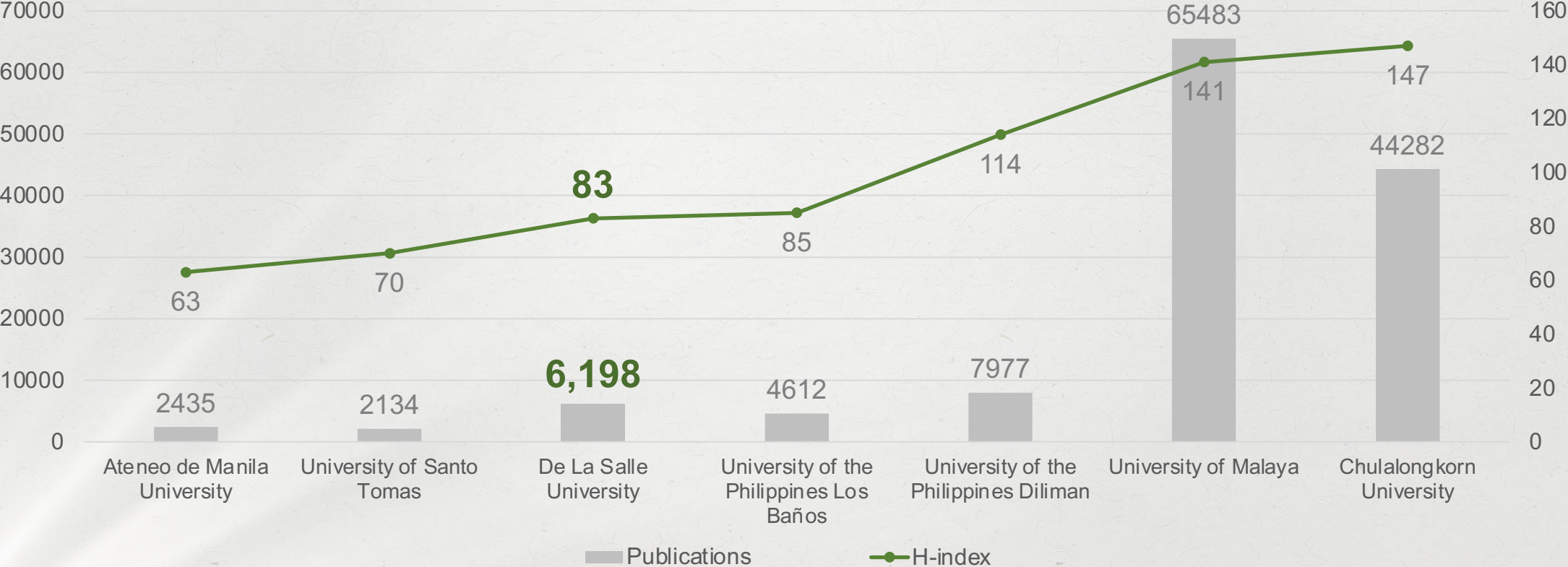
DLSU annual output of Scopus-indexed publications vis-à-vis selected leading Philippine HEIs

As of August 2022



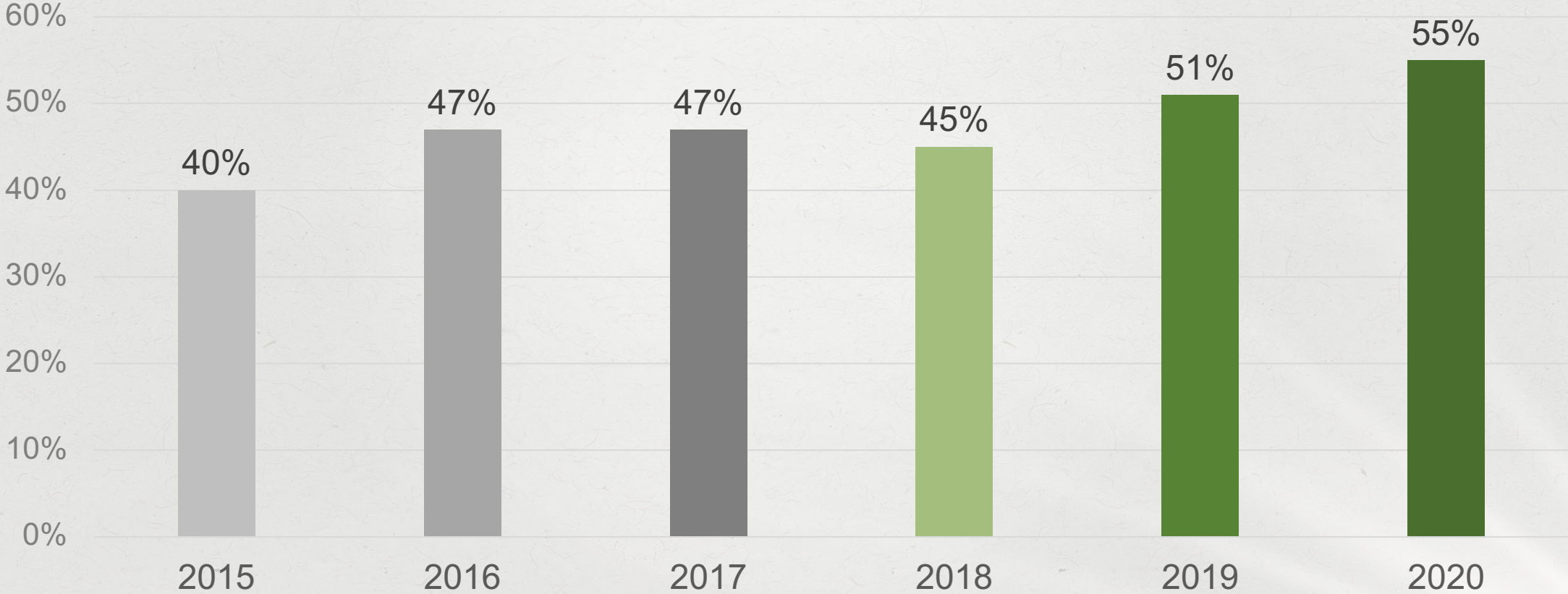
DLSU Key Research Productivity Indicators vis-à-vis selected institutions

From 2015 to 2020

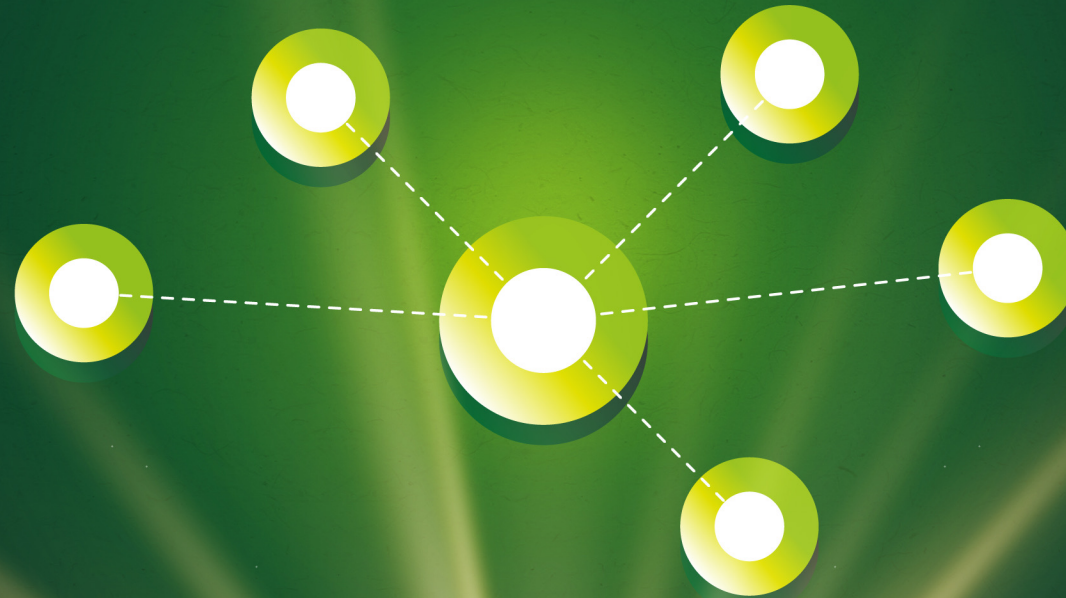

A SUGGESTED GUIDE FOR FACULTY

1. Encourage students to turn on their videos during the class. Emphasize that doing so will help make the session feel like we are here for each other.
2. Acknowledge that these are difficult times for everyone. Let the students know that whatever they are feeling is valid.
3. Set some simple ground rules. Some suggestions are the following:
 - Listen for understanding.
 - Assume good will.
 - Share airtime.
 - It's OK to disagree, but don't personalize.
 - Speak for yourself, not for others.
 - What's said here stays here, other than broad themes
 - No recording allowed.
4. Set some structure for what will be shared. Suggested structure is below:
 - Share experiences, feelings, worries or fears
 - Share effective coping strategies
 - Share sources of support and strength
5. You may share your own thoughts and feelings with the students.
6. Not everyone will be comfortable to share. Assure them the it is okay not to share if they are not ready or comfortable.

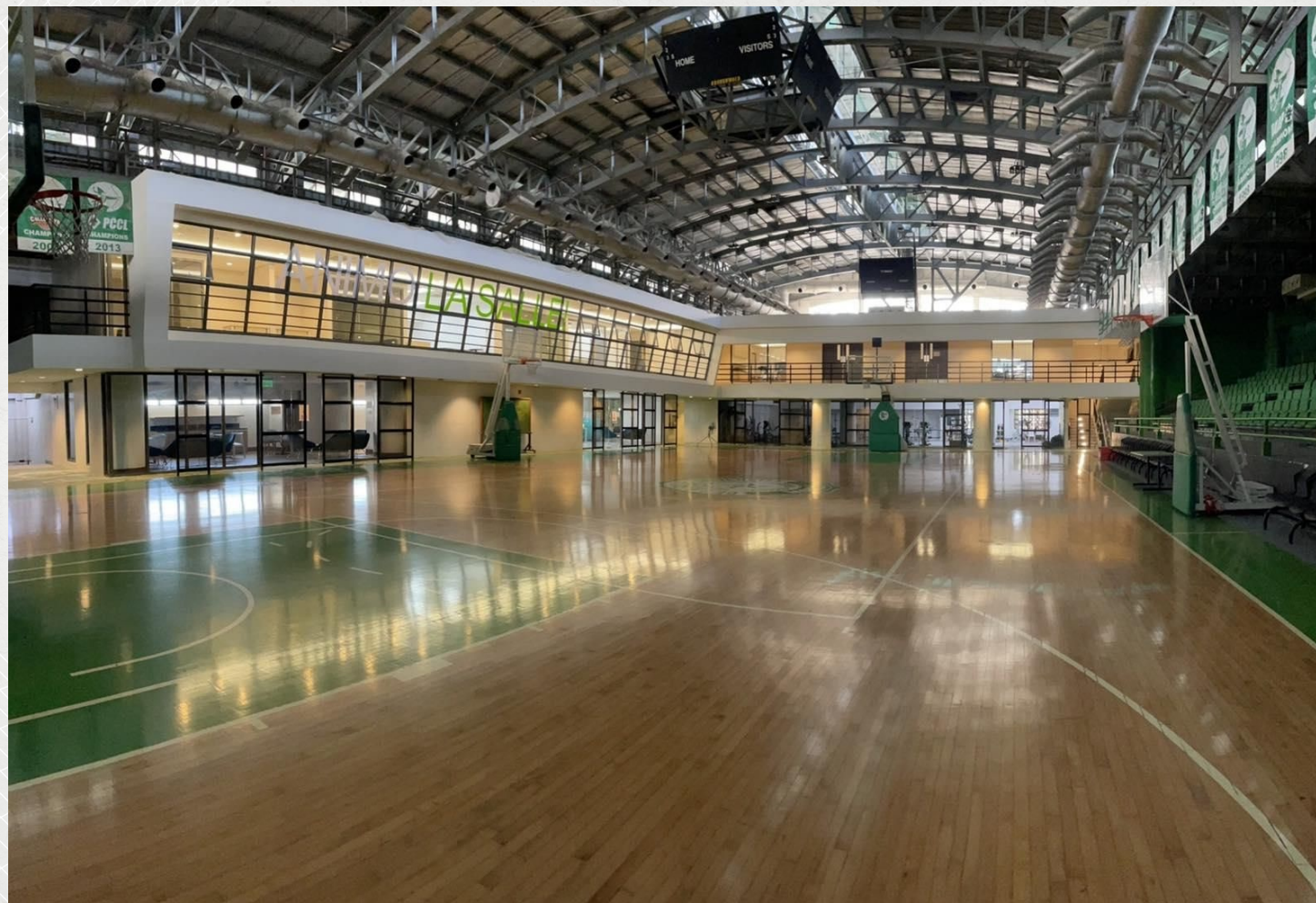


Infrastructure Development
